

This tragedy MUST stop. And with your help, it can.



Why there's a water crisis...

As New Zealanders, we know how harsh droughts and floods can be. But we can still sometimes take clean water for granted. Right now though, in certain parts of the world, pressure on water supplies is reaching critical levels. Here are the three main causes of a deadly water crisis...

Booming Population

Rising populations and expanding cities are driving up demand for water to the point where supply and infrastructure simply cannot keep up.

Changing Climates

Droughts, floods, and extreme weather events reduce already-scarce water availability, contaminate water sources, and damage infrastructure... making it even harder to access safe water.

Conflict & Migration

Limited water resources lead to tension between communities desperate to survive. Conflict can further disrupt water access and force families to migrate, which adds to the strain on water supplies in other areas.

The water crisis is especially lifethreatening for people with disabilities living in poverty – often the first to be left behind in a crisis.

Dirty water is a huge problem in the world's poorest places, and the impact on children is truly devastating.

Diarrhoea caused by waterborne diseases like cholera and dysentery can be deadly for people of all ages, but the speed with which they can kill small children is truly terrifying. Often in just a matter of hours.

In less acute situations, the impact of poor access to safe water is still incredibly harmful to children. Many live in isolated

rural areas and spend hours every day walking long distances to collect water for their family when they should be in school.

This has a disproportionate impact on girls, as fetching water is considered the responsibility of women and girls in 7 out of 10 households.

As Community Leader, Hussain, told us... "Children miss school regularly because they cannot get to school on time and when they do, they are too tired to learn."

Communities like Hussain's cannot go another day without safe water.

In Hussain's community, women and children have to walk long distances to get water from either a manmade lake or a hand-dug open well.

Not only can the water they collect make them very sick, but it is also extremely dangerous to walk this journey alone.

"Getting water, especially in dry season is very challenging," says Hussain. "Our women are not safe, they are at risk when they walk long distances to get water."

Today, around **2.2 billion** people – or 1 in 4 – still lack safely managed drinking water at home.

Nearly **700 million** children can't access basic hygiene services like a place to wash their hands.

Close to **2 billion**people worldwide
use drinking water
contaminated with faeces.

Over **500,000** deaths each year are estimated to be linked to diseases related to dirty water.
